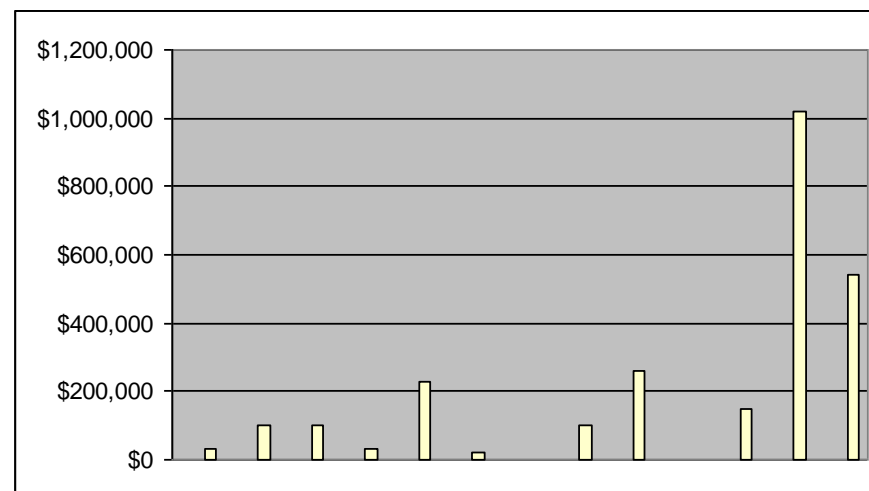


Summary:

- A total of 19 grants were made in the period 1996-2010 (this number does not take into account Doc Photo grantees or "Katrina" grantees) amounting to \$ 2,582,200.
- Noticeable increase in grantmaking in 2009 and 2010, with grants from Seize the day and CBMA.
- 5 grants, or 26% of total grantmaking made between 1996 and 2010, were for general support.
- General support amounted to \$460,000 and project support to \$2,122,000.
